

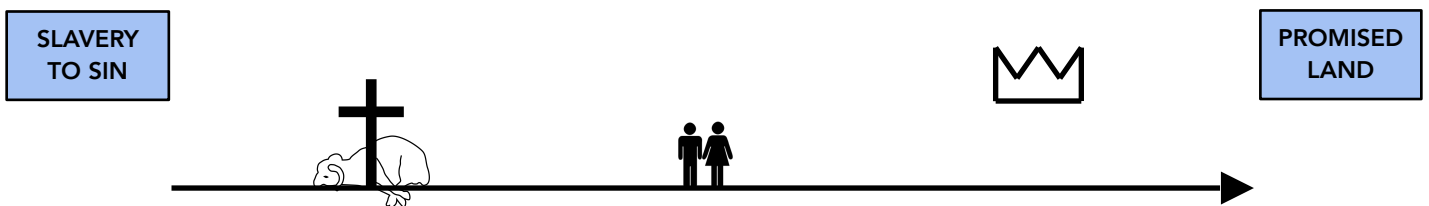

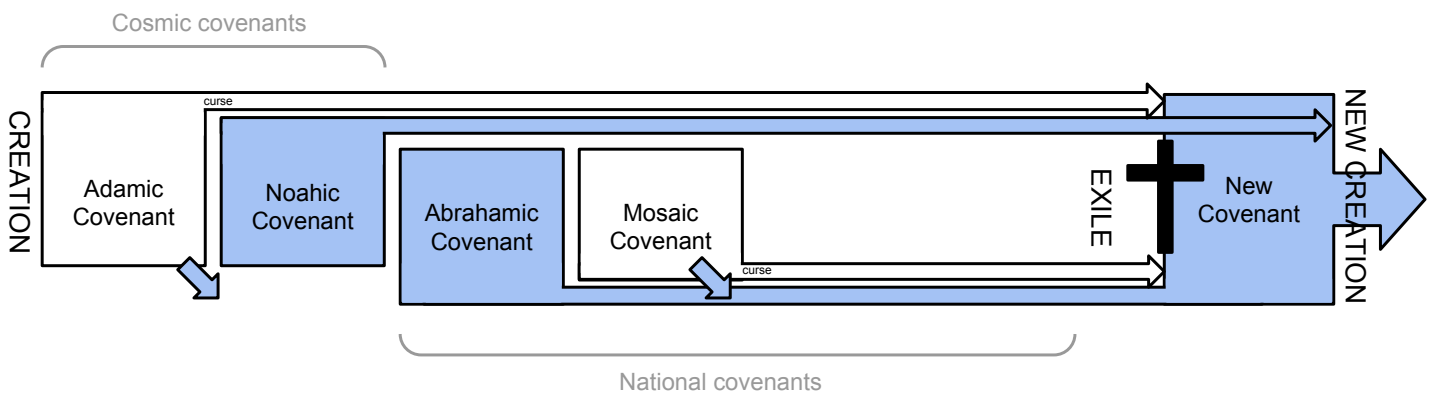

- Experiencing the tension between the covenants

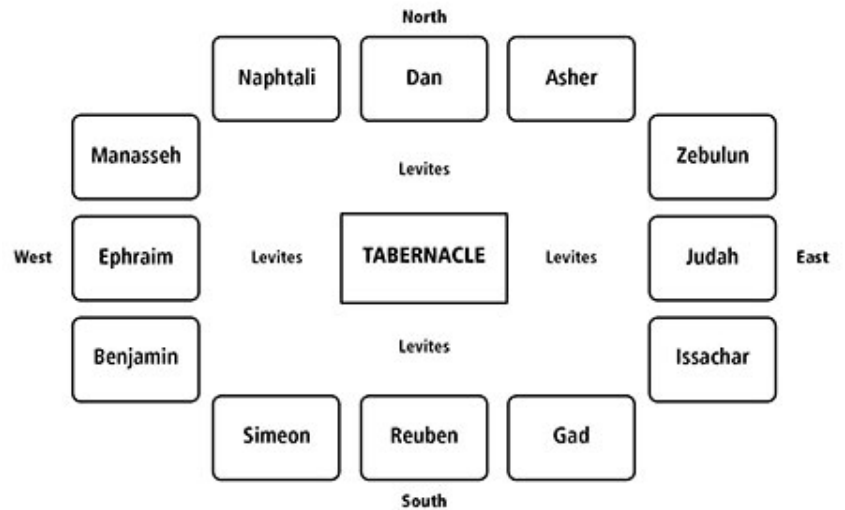


- 'Suzerain-vassal' type covenants

(Numbers 11-25)

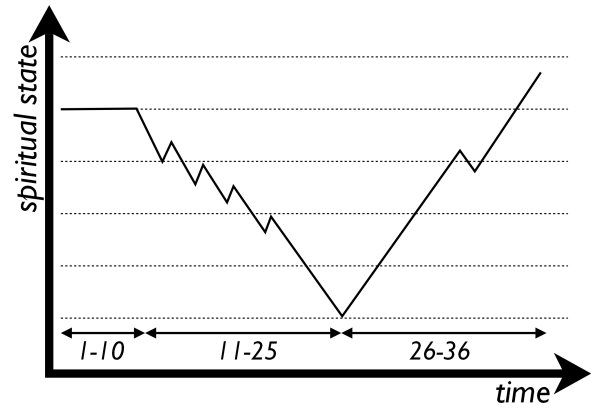
- A rejection of God

(Numbers 25:7-18)

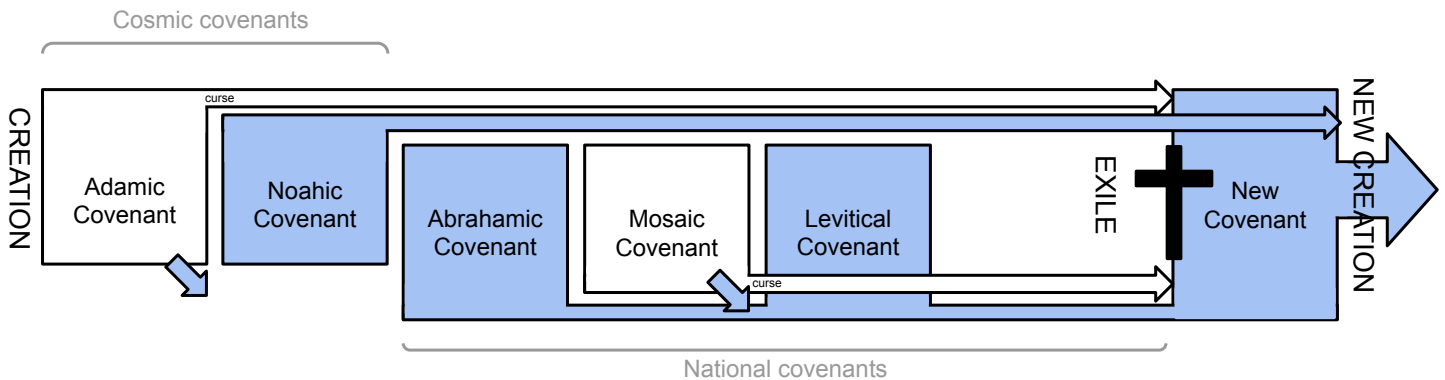
- Phinehas' zeal
