


• Obedient king = blessed people

2) Life in the northern kingdom of Israel Kings of Israel led the people in evil (1-2 Kings) Idolatry God keeps warning God keeps a remnant Injustice Presumption • Prophets of Israel acted as enforcers (Hosea, Amos, Jonah) Threatened covenant curses and destruction Called for repentance and justice Gave glimpses of cosmic restoration Israel ultimately assimilated by Assyria (2 Kings 17) • Assyria itself falls under God's judgment (Nahum) 3) Life in the southern kingdom of Judah Kings of Judah led the people variously (2 Kings 16, 18) ▶ Idolatry & fidelity ▶ Injustice & justice Presumption & humility

• Earlier prophets acted as enforcers

- (Micah, Isaiah)
- Threatened covenant curses and exile
- Called for repentance and justice
- Explicit cosmic hope in a Davidic King
- Later prophets called for faith
